Meryl Brown is a master's trained and board certified music therapist, having practiced music therapy for over 10 years. She is a professional member of both the American Music Therapy Association and the Illinois Association for Music Therapy, where she has served as both student coordinator and treasurer in previous years. She received her master's degree in Music Therapy from Illinois State University and holds a bachelor's degree from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam, where she majored in Music Education.

Meryl has been providing music therapy services since 2006, and has worked with a variety of populations including early intervention, individuals with autism, pediatrics and pediatric intensive care, adult mental health, and older adults.

Meryl received her credential as a Developmental Specialist in January of 2008, which allows her to work more closely with children ages 0-3 years in the Early Intervention Program in the state of Illinois. Meryl has written articles and music for a variety of publications focusing on Early Childhood and Parenting, and has completed presentations on music therapy, wellness and work/life balance at the local, regional and national level.

Meryl is Founder and Director of Developing Melodies Music Therapy Center, located in Bloomington IL. She and her staff provide music therapy services for large contracts throughout the community and individuals and groups on-site. In addition, Meryl is a drum circle facilitator, and leads drum circles for enhancing group morale and building community spirit.

Victoria Storm, MT-BC

Master's trained and Board Certified Music Therapist, Victoria Storm, has been using the transformative power of music to assist students, clients, patients, and their families to meet their goals for nearly 25 years. Through active listening to music, singing, drumming and playing instruments, dancing and moving, composing and songwriting, Victoria provides opportunities for gaining insights through the joy of music exploration and self expression for individuals and groups. Clients exercise new behaviors and skills during group times, develop a deep sense of listening to others and practice responding with respect and understanding.

In addition to her music education students (guitar, ukulele, and voice) and music therapy private practice work with differently abled children and young adults through Oak Park Music Therapy, Victoria's clinical background includes her hospice, oncology, post-stroke, and mental health work at Alexian Brothers Hospitals / AMITA Health. Prior, she enjoyed 7 years at Children's Memorial Hospital, 8 years at the Institute for Therapy through the Arts in a variety of contract settings, and 2 years at Hartgrove Hospital, where she also completed her MT internship. She presents regularly to professional audiences on music therapy, and is a regular guest lecturer at Columbia College in the Expressive Arts Therapy program. Her Master and Bachelor of Music degrees with majors in Music Therapy are from Western Michigan University. There she also provided clinical supervision and course lectures for undergraduate MT students. Victoria is a singer/songwriter and performer, forever dedicated to the healing power of music.
